At the ceremony, the undefeated 1960 Boys' Basketball Team was inducted, with team members Martin Padgett, Gary Deckers, Jesse McLean and Sam Wynkoop representing their teammates and coaches. The team, the School's first known State Champions, posted a record of 57 wins and 4 loses during the period 59/60/61, including a 30-game consecutive win streak during the 60-61 seasons. The induction took place right under their championship banner that likely has been hanging in the gym since soon after their championship! Athletic Director Demario Newman and Richie Andresen (61) served as coemcees for the beautiful ceremony during which commemorative trophies were presented to the team members who were in attendance. After that presentation, Richie presented to the three current Surrattsville basketball coaches – on behalf of the 19 60 team – plaques to honor them for their role in keeping the Hornets hoops tradition alive at the School. - 7. MORE PRICELESS TREASURES FROM "GREEN LIGHT." As we previously noted, in 2015 Duke Coleman (53) donated to the Foundation's Archives a number of copies of an early SHS student newspaper, the "Green Light." Those editions provide a fascinating glimpse into student life at Surrattsville during the 52-53 academic year, 65 years ago! Here are some interesting excerpts from the January 15, 1953 edition of Green Light:

"Your Ideas Please?: This Friday you'll find a chance to really express yourself – everything from brainstorm to the latest gossip. How? There will be a suggestion box in the hall by the bulletin board. Just write your contribution on a piece of paper and drop it in – remain anonymous if you wish. Here are some possibilities to be thinking about: 1. Ideas about the routine of SHS; 2. Articles for the Green Light – sports, gossip, news, parties; 3. Suggestions for clubs; 4. Suggestions for the improvement of the Green Light. And any other item that may be of interest. We hope you will take advantage of this box and come up with some useful ideas and suggestions. All items become the property of the Journalism Class and none will be returned.

Library Receives New Books: Our school library has gotten approximately 150 new books this year. Some of the books you will find to read are the American Adventure Series. Such reading as Kit Carson, Jack Knight and The Rush for Gold is present in the library now. There are a stet of twelve books about Lands and Peoples of Other Countries. And if you wish to find a few

points on how to improve your personality, charm, beauty and best of all, how to dress, you will find a set of six books on these subjects. You can also see and read the book called Year. It has been written in 75,000 words, 1,000 pictures and on 3,000 subjects so if you like to read – and I hope you do – I suggest you pay a visit to our library.

The Polaroid Model 20: Back in the days when the only electronics needed for Crestview Manor survival was an AM/FM radio, a stereo and a TV set, I collected Top Value stamps, the golden relative of the green stamp. From all the valuable items listed, the best I could do for my filled book was a rowing machine -- why I don't remember -- and a Model 20 Polaroid Swinger Land Camera!

This particular camera allowed you to view your photo in under a minute, and it came with a coating gel to preserve the image. I seem to remember the film costing between \$3 and \$5.

How my father kept his cool after forking out money for camera film is a testament to human kindness. The only place that sold it was People's Drug Store. The brothers Chesley and I tested the new toy out on a cool August day. With only eight shots per role, "Heroes of Crestview" was our testament to fun times with a modestly priced camera and expensive film. These same black and whites were mailed to "Anna" at college, and retrieved years later when she found them in a water damaged cedar chest in her basement. She loaned them to me with the promise that I would return them. When last we spoke, she still wanted them back.

Others photos were taken of the summer band and added to the Surrattsville junior high band photo album, but lost after Mr. Hinckle moved on to Potomac High School.
