3.SURRATTSVILLE COMMUNITY LOSES BELOVED EDUCATOR. We just learned that beloved and longtime Surrattsville math teacher, Anne Noyes, died on March 20. Anne was born in Birmingham, AL in 1930 to a long line of teachers, and earned her math degree at George Washington University in 1950, a rarity for women at the time. She began teaching at Surrattsville after graduation, and after retiring from the Prince George's County schools continued to teach at St. Agnes/St. Stephen's in Alexandria. Her outstanding teaching abilities, reflected in her motto "Strict but Fair," earned her "favorite teacher" status from many students during her 40-year career at Surrattsville and in Alexandria. Anne is survived by two daughters, a brother and sister-in-law, four grandchildren, and nieces and nephews. Contributions in memory of Anne may be made to Macland Presbyterian Church to support students and teachers, 3615 Macland Road, Powder Springs, GA 30127. We extend our heartfelt sympathies to the family and friends of this wonderful Surrattsville educator.

5.THOMAS V. MIKE MILLER, JR. (60) HONORED AS AN ICON!
