1. FOUNDATION GRANTS 2016 SCHOLARSHIPS! We are proud to announce these recipients of this year's Foundation Scholarships:

-JENELLE COLLIER was awarded the Foundation's Esther Clifton Miller Memorial Scholarship, which was endowed by Esther's daughter Nancy Miller (67). Jenelle maintained a GPA of 4.125 and was valedictorian of the Class of 2016. She served as Vice President of the SGA, was a Girls' State representative, was Captain of the Girls' Basketball team and played varsity Softball, was first chair in the strings section of the Orchestra, was President of the Chorus, was Editor of the Yearbook, and participated in numerous community service projects.

-ATIBA MCGILL was awarded The Foundation's General Fund scholarship. While at Surratts, Atiba was on the Honor Roll, was Vice President of the Class of 2016, and participated in AFJROTC, SGA, Chorus, History Club, the Student Leaders organization, the Debate League and Organizing for Action. For his outstanding achievements as Wing/Group Commander of the School's AFJROTC unit, he was awarded its highest award, the Jesse J. Ware Award. Atiba is also very active in community activities at his church.

-MONIQUE COUNTISS was awarded the Foundation's Thomas V. Miller, Sr. Memorial Scholarship, which was endowed by his daughter Nancy Miller (67). While at Surratts, Monique participated in Volleyball, GEMS (a peer mentoring program sponsored by the Guidance Department), the Art Club, the Ceramics Club and served as a volunteer working with profoundly disabled students in the School's Special Education Department.

2. 2016 ACHIEVEMENT AWARD RECIPIENTS NAMED. The Foundation also is proud to announce this year's Achievement Award recipients. They are:

-LAMAR TYLER (94). Using his motto "The Gatekeepers Are Gone," Lamar, along with his wife Ronnie, has successfully grown the couple's website Black and Married with Kids (<https://blackandmarriedwithkids.com>) to become the largest independent, African American marriage and parenting site on the web. Armed with a passion for empowering married couples and a knowledge of how to leverage social media, Lamar and Ronnie have taken Tyler New Media and Black and Married with Kids from a small personal blog to an international brand that

also boasts five independently produced films and a social media presence that includes over 500,000 Facebook fans. In 2012, the Tylers were acknowledged on Ebony Magazine's Power 100 list of the country's most influential African-Americans which included President Barack Obama, Beyonce, Jay-Z and Tyler Perry among its ranks. In addition to the Ebony Power 100 Lamar and Ronnie have also been featured as finalists for the Black Enterprise Family Business of the Year Award and Infusionsoft's Small Business ICON competition.

-JOHN "SKILLET" ULMSCHNEIDER (97). John, a 13-year veteran Prince George's County firefighter-paramedic, gave his life in the line of duty while making a medical welfare check at a home in Temple Hills. Prince George's County Police Chief Hank Stawinski said the person inside the home did not answer a knock at the door by authorities, and a decision was made to enter the house to check on the individual. As the first responders were attempting to enter, the person in the home fired several shots through the door, hitting John and another firefighters as well as the concerned relative who made the call. Police said no officer fired any gunshots and the gunman in the home was taken into custody at the time. John left behind a wife and two year-old daughter. According to Prince George's County Executive Rushern Baker, "Unfortunately, I've got to go before the people of Prince George's County and let them know that we have lost another one of our brave firefighters doing what they do every day. These men and women put their lives on the line, and unfortunately tonight, we lost one of them. This is a sad day in Prince George's County."

-NANCY MILLER (67). Nancy is a successful attorney, living and practicing in Prince George's County and maintaining an office in Clinton that serves the Surrattsville community. Over the past several years, Nancy's commitment to her alma mater and the great kids at Surrattsville has taken the extraordinarily generous form of endowing two named Foundation scholarships, the Esther Clifton Miller Memorial Scholarship and the Thomas V. Miller, Sr. Memorial Scholarship. These two scholarships provide significant monetary grants to graduating seniors whose activities at SHS and plans for the future reflect the values and life's work of Nancy's parents. Nancy also generously funded a significant addition to the account of the Foundation's General Fund Scholarship, permitting it to increase its annual awards to deserving graduates. Like the philanthropic example set by Charlie Cooper (52) in the early days of the Foundation when he endowed the Foundation's Principals/Faculty/Staff Memory Fund, the Foundation is hopeful that Nancy's recent generosity will inspire others to establish additional named scholarships provided through the Foundation.

3. ACHIEVEMENT AWARD RECIPIENT NAMED UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT. And, speaking of Achievement Award recipients, we just saw the following exciting press release from Dartmouth about 2008 Achievement Award recipient Rick Lifton (71):

"Richard Lifton (Dartmouth 75) was named the 11th president of the Rockefeller University, a world-renowned center for research and graduate education in biomedical sciences, chemistry, and physics based in New York City. Lifton, the Sterling Professor of Genetics and chair of the

Department of Genetics at Yale University, will succeed Marc Tessier-Lavigne, who is leaving Rockefeller University to become Stanford University's next president. Lifton's appointment is effective Sept. 1, 2016, reports Rockefeller University in a news release. After graduating from Dartmouth, Lifton received his MD and PhD degrees from Stanford, and served his medical residency at Brigham and Women's Hospital. He is a member of the National Academy of Sciences and the National Academy of Medicine, co-chaired the planning committee for President Obama's Precision Medicine Initiative in 2015, and was recognized with a 2014 Breakthrough Prize in Life Sciences. Fellow Dartmouth alumnus and former member of the Dartmouth Board of Trustees Russell Carson '65, chair of the Rockefeller University board of trustees, said in the release that Lifton was the board's unanimous first choice for president. "Rick is a strong, persuasive advocate for the importance of science in improving human health and society. We are confident that Rick is going to be an exceptional president," Carson said. Lifton called Rockefeller University a "remarkably vibrant" and unique scientific community. "Rockefeller is ideally positioned to extend its spectacular record of leadership in science and medicine. I look forward to helping shape the bright future of this great university," he said."

Others who entered better be taking photos and saving them for next year’s contest.

Home Ec News: the 10-G girls that take home ec are working on a bulletin board at the far end of the hall. The girls in Mrs. Merritt’s 5th hour class are working with centerpieces. While the 8th grade girls are learning how to get a man, for the past week they have been baking cakes and cupcakes.

Senior News: The Seniors are sure being kept busy trying to get the Boomerang out to press. Trying to decide which pictures to put in the year book is one of the many problems, along with trying to decide what to write beneath the pictures when they do get them. We all hope Mrs. Hollan will enjoy the toaster presented to her in homeroom period, by the Senior Class. Everyone has been measured for caps and gowns and we hope that they fit, which means no extra sweets between now and graduation. All of the Senior girls want to welcome our substitute teacher, Miss Leitch, and by the looks of things she is going to do a wonderful job.

The pet peeves in Surrattsville range from tastes in food to personality traits.
