1. GO HORNETS (UPDATE). The new board members attended the senior award ceremony. While at the ceremony the board members witnessed a handful of seniors enter the seven figure club. The seven figure club consists of students that received over \$1,000,000 in scholarships. The total reported scholarship amounts was 7,128,000. What a wonderful achievement for our new alum! The foundation awarded four scholarships to Kahlib Newman, Thomas Hedgepeth, Berri Rawls, Zoe Hamilton. The Mary Surratt chapter, written by Laurie Verge, the director of the Surratt House and Museum, is particularly interesting, and along with many other references in the book provide new insights into the strange – and certainly unique – history behind the name of our alma mater.
