1. SURRATTSVILLE COMMUNITY LOSES VERY SPECIAL HORNET. We were saddened to learn that Dave Seyler (73) died on October 30 after a long and valiant battle with cancer. Dave, a master trumpet player, was involved in many activities while at Surrattsville, and was awarded the highest award for instrumental musicians at SHS, the John Philip Sousa Award. Dave was a great supporter of the Foundation, having volunteered his considerable talents as a performer to the Foundation's "Surrattstock" fund raising events. After Surrattsville, Dave played in the outstanding jazz fusion group, Blue Horizon, with John Previti (72) and other Hornets. After graduating from the University of MD with a degree in music education, Dave made his way to a highly successful career in trade journalism, including a stint as editor in chief of the Radio and TV Business Report and having held other prestigious positions. Dave also was a freelance writer, authoring creative and witty columns about current events. He was widely admired among his peers in the journalism community (for both his journalism skills and his skills on the baseball and softball diamonds!). In his final years, Dave performed music with his Dixieland band around his home in North Carolina. Dave is survived by his wife Amy, his children Sarah and Paul, three brothers, and two sisters.

By the end of the night over \$150,000 had been raised to benefit students of Prince George's County. The Gala lived up to it's name-it truly was like none other.
